C O N F E R E N C E B A C K G R O U N D

The genesis of the “Ukraine’s Quest for Mature Nation Statehood: A Roundtable” series took place in April 2000, when a number of Ukrainian/American organizations convened to consider ways to support the ‘dialogue’ that was unfolding between the U.S. and Ukraine. These deliberations gave rise to a commitment: to convene a conference that would bring together prominent representatives from academia and the governments of Ukraine and the United States to assess Ukraine’s prospects for accelerated integration into the Euro Atlantic Community and stronger bilateral relations.

To help fulfill the commitment, four key sources were tapped. The Ukrainian Congressional Caucus and the Ukrainian Embassy were asked to garner political support in the U.S. and in Ukraine, respectively. Major American universities, think tanks, and NGOs were invited to lend their good names and to supply important contacts. Major American and Ukrainian-American financial and commercial institutions were invited to provide the necessary financial wherewithal.

In September 2000, these efforts culminated in a singular event held at the Library of Congress and at the Council on Foreign Relations in Washington, D.C. The two-day conference featured 84 speakers representing the most prestigious members of America’s and Ukraine’s representatives in the foreign policy field. Major segments of the conference were web-cast live worldwide; the entire conference was video taped by the U.S. Department of State for subsequent airing at various venues. A complete transcript of the proceedings was produced for purposes of publishing a monograph in both the English and Ukrainian languages.

By all accounts the conference was a complete success. The U.S. and Ukrainian governments, the policy formulation establishment in both countries, the academic community and NGOs all regarded the conference as having made a significant contribution to the furtherance of U.S./Ukraine relations.

Based on the success of their effort, the Ukrainian/American initiators of “Ukraine’s Quest for Mature Nation Statehood: A Roundtable I” reconvened in November 2000. The meeting led to a second commitment: to convene “Roundtable II: Taking Measure of a US-Ukraine Strategic Partnership I”.

S T A T E M E N T O F P U R P O S E

"Ukraine's Quest for Mature Nation Statehood - Roundtable II: Taking Measure of a U.S./Ukraine Strategic Partnership",
October 31/November 1, 2001,

Washington, D.C., will bring together prominent representatives from academia and the governments of Ukraine and the U.S. to evaluate the relationship between the two countries and the role that their strategic partnership has and will continue to play in promoting their common goals and respective national interests.

Over the course of the last decade, relations between the U.S. and Ukraine have undergone significant change. Two principal, overarching factors have emerged, which today constitute and justify the strategic nature of that relationship: global security and regional stability.

Beyond these core considerations; there are critical direct benefits to be derived from a strong bilateral relationship.

The prospects for advancing the strategic partnership will, in large measure, depend on Ukraine's ability to further develop the requisite internal institutional framework to move toward assuming the responsibilities of a major player in the region and beyond. In this,

the role of the U.S. as a countervailing force to external pressures seeking to undermine Ukraine's emergence as a member of the Euro Atlantic community may prove crucial.

For Ukraine, nothing less than the sustainability of its sovereignty and independence is at stake.

For the U.S., the corresponding issue is whether or not there will be finality with regard to the possible reemergence of a hegemonic power on the Eurasian landmass.

The purpose of "Ukraine's Quest For Mature Nation Statehood-Roundtable II: Taking Measure of a U.S./Ukraine Strategic Partnership", is to objectively assess the capacity of both countries to make the requisite political, economic, diplomatic and military commitments to the realization of these strategic objectives.

The goal of the Roundtable is to provide, inter alia, a valuable cache of information, analysis and insight pertinent to U.S./Ukraine strategic relations for the new administration in Washington, D.C. and the newly appointed Cabinet of Ministers in Kyiv.

ANDERS ASLUND

Anders Aslund is a Senior Associate at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace in Washington, D.C. Dr. Aslund served as an economic advisor to the Russian government from 1991 to 1994, and as an economic advisor to the Ukrainian government from 1994 to 1997. Since 1998, he has advised the government of Kyrgyzstan.

BORIS BAZYLEVSKYI

Boris Bazylevskiy is Ukraine's Consul-General in Chicago. Prior to his posting in the United States, Consul-General Bazylevski served as Secretariat Director of the Ukrainian Parliament's Committee on Foreign Affairs and Relations with the CIS.

ANDREW BIHUN

Andrew Bihun serves as International Trade Specialist with the U.S. Department of Commerce. In the mid 1990s, Mr. Bihun held the post of Commercial Attache at the U.S. Embassy to Ukraine.

IVAN BILAS

Ivan Bilas has been a member of the Parliament of Ukraine from 1994 to the present and is the Chairman of the Committee on Law Enforcement. He holds the rank of General in the National Guard of Ukraine. Since 1998, General Bilas has been the President of the Union of Ukrainian Officers.

IAN BRZEZINSKI

Ian Brzezinski is a Senior Professional Staff Member of the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations. In this capacity, he advises the ranking Republican member of the Committee, Senator Jesse Helms (R-NC), on matters concerning U.S. interests in Europe, Russia and Ukraine, including those pertaining to NATO, EU, and the OSCE. Mr. Brzezinski also serves as the Secretary of the U.S. Senate Delegation to the NATO Parliamentary Assembly.

VICTOR CHUDOWSKY

Victor Chudowsky is a Program Officer at Meridian International Center, where he has worked on Freedom Support Act programs for political leaders from Ukraine and other newly independent states. In the late 1990s, Dr. Chudowsky was a visiting scholar at the National Institute of Strategic Studies in Kyiv.

STACY CLOSSON

Stacy Closson served as the Ukraine Country Manager in the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy from November 1998 to August 2001. She currently works at the Caucasus Desk. In January 2001, Ms. Closson was the recipient of the Secretary of Defense Award for Exceptional Civilian Service.

ARIEL COHEN

Ariel Cohen is the Research Fellow in Russian and Eurasian Studies at the Heritage Foundation. Dr. Cohen manages a policy research program on Russia, the New Independent States and Central Europe, consulting Congressional staff members and leading American, Russian, Ukrainian, Polish, Hungarian and other Eurasian, Eastern and Central European decision makers.

LEONARD COBURN

Leonard Coburn is Director of New Independent States, Russia and Middle East Affairs at the United States Department of Energy. In his capacity, Mr. Coburn is a key figure with regard to U.S. energy policy vis a vis Ukraine.

WILLIAM H. COURTNEY

William H. Courtney is President of DynCorp. From 1998 to 2000, he served as a senior advisor at the Congressionally-chaired U.S. Commission on Security and Cooperation in Europe. In 1997-98, Ambassador Courtney was Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director of the National Security Council staff for Russia, Ukraine and Eurasia. Previously, he served as Ambassador to Georgia and Kazakhstan.

NADIA DIUK

Nadia Diuk currently serves as Senior Program Officer for Central and Eastern Europe and the New Independent States at the National Endowment for Democracy, a private nonprofit organization funded by the U.S. Congress to strengthen democratic institutions around the world through nongovernmental efforts. Dr. Diuk has supervised NED programs in this complex region since 1987.

PAULA DOBRIANSKY

Paula Dobriansky is Under Secretary of State for Global Affairs. While her present post requires a focus on U.S. relations with the International Community, Under Secretary Dobriansky is an acknowledged expert on matters relating to the post-Soviet space; from 1981 to 1987, she served in various posts in the Directorate on European and Soviet Affairs at the National Security Council.

JAROSLAV DUTKEVYCH

Jaroslav Dutkevych was the first Country Director of the U.S. Peace Corps in Ukraine from 1992 to 2000. He developed and directed one of the largest and most successful U.S. Peace Corps and U.S. assistance programs in Ukraine.

JONATHAN ELKIND

Jonathan Elkind is a Senior Research Associate at the Joint Global Change Research Institute, a collaboration of the University of Maryland and the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory. From August 1998 to February 2001, Dr. Elkind served on the staff of the NSC as Director for Russian, Ukrainian, and Eurasian Affairs. His portfolio included energy and environmental issues throughout the post-Soviet states, as well as lead responsibility for relations with the countries of the Caucasus and Central Asia.

DOUGLAS FEITH

Douglas Feith is Under Secretary of Defense for Policy. USDPFeith's responsibilities include myriad issues: arms control, multilateral 'threat reduction' conventions of various kinds, NATO matters and, perhaps most critical, the development of new 'security' paradigms.

BOHDAN FUTEY

Bohdan Futey has served as a Judge of the United States Court of Federal Claims since 1987. Judge Futey is actively involved with Democratization and Rule of Law programs organized by the Judicial Conference of the U.S., the Department of State and the American Bar Association in Ukraine and Russia.

MICHAEL HALTZEL

Michael Haltzel is senior foreign policy advisor to Senator Joseph R. Biden, Jr. (D-Delaware), Chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, and Staff Director of the Subcommittee on European Affairs of the Committee. He is the lead Democratic Senate staffer on NATO and Balkan policy. Dr. Haltzel came to the Senate in 1994 from the Library of Congress, where he was Chief of the European Division.

OLEXIY HARAN

Olexiy Haran is both Professor of Political Science and Director of the Center for National Security Studies at the University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy (UKMA). Dr. Haran is a member of the President's Public Advisory Board [Ukraine] and serves as a member of the advisory board of Kennan Institute [U.S.].

BOHDAN HAWRYLYSHYN

Bohdan Hawrylyshyn is the Director of the Vidrogenia Foundation. Dr. Hawrylyshyn serves as special advisor to the Prime Minister of Ukraine Anatoliy Kinakh and the Speaker of the Ukrainian Parliament Ivan Plyshch.

KOSTYANTYN HRYSHCHENKO

Kostyantyn Hryshchenko is the Ambassador of Ukraine to the United States of America. Ambassador Hryshchenko also serves as a member of the UN Advisory Board on Disarmament Matters. He served as Ambassador of Ukraine to the Kingdom of Belgium, the Kingdom of the Netherlands, the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and as the Head of the Ukrainian Mission to NATO from 1998 to 2000.

ANATOLIY HRYTSENKO

Anatoliy Hrytsenko is President of the Razymkov Center. The Razymkov Center is considered to be one of the most prestigious political think tanks in Ukraine.

ROBERT HUGHES

Robert Hughes is the current Chief, Regional Plans and Issues Division for the USAF Director of Operational Plans and Joint Matters. Immediately prior to taking on the current post, Colonel Hughes served as Defense Attache at the United States Embassy in Ukraine.

NATALIE JARESKO

Natalie Jaresko was named to the post of President and CEO of the Western NIS Enterprise Fund in February 2001. She is responsible for managing the Fund's strategic development, setting long-term business goals for portfolio companies and attracting capital to expand business opportunities. As a consequence of the horrible terrorist attacks against the United States of America, the decision was taken to postpone the Roundtable from September 20/21, 2001 to October 31/November 1, 2001. We are deeply grateful to the Patrons of the Roundtable for their understanding and their selfless and essential contributions. We also express our sincere appreciation to the many dedicated volunteers in the U.S and Ukraine who have work tirelessly with us to assure the success of the Roundtable. We appreciate all of these efforts and trust that the confidence and support, from which the Steering Committee has benefited so much, will continue into the future as well.

Our prayers are with the families of the innocent victims of the terrorist attacks. May those who lost their lives find eternal peace with the Lord and may He grant their families the strength to persevere through these difficult times.
