BRIEF HISTORY

A large wave of Ukrainian immigrants to North and South America, as well as to Australia, following the Second World War, became the catalyst for the establishment of the *World Congress of Free Ukrainians* (WCFU). After years of planning, in 1967, the First World Congress of Free Ukrainians took place in New York City. The event united Ukrainians from 17 countries and gave the diaspora an opportunity to proclaim to the world its support for the renewal of an independent Ukrainian state, its solidarity with Ukraine's struggle for liberation, and its readiness to assist the Ukrainian nation by any means possible.

During the 1970s and 1980s – the period of the Cold War –WCFU was particularly active in the defense of human and national rights for the Ukrainian people with its participation in demonstrations and international forums, as well as in its cooperation with international human rights organizations.

With the proclamation of Ukraine's independence in 1991 – the World Congress of Free Ukrainians changed its name to *Ukrainian World Congress* (UWC) in 1993, and directed its activities toward the consolidation of the Ukrainian State. Another important area of activity for the UWC throughout its existence has been to support the mobilization and development of the Ukrainian diaspora for the protection and defense of its rights and interests, as well as for the preservation outside Ukraine of the national identity, spiritual values, language culture and other national values.

Today, UWC encompasses a network of member organizations and Ukrainian contacts in 53 countries around the world, and is recognized by the United Nations Economic and Social Council as a non-governmental organization with special consultative status.

Throughout its history, the mission of the UWC has always been guided by the aspirations of the Ukrainian people.

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Valeriy Chaly

Valeriy Chaly presently serves as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Ukraine to the United States. He came to the post immediately after having held the position of Deputy Head of Administration of the President of Ukraine. Prior to his political and foreign services appointments, Ambassador Chaly worked a number of years as Deputy Director General of Ukraine's leading NGO, the Razumkov Center, gaining recognition in Ukraine as well as internationally for his efforts at the institution.

Eugene Czolij

Eugene Czolij has served as the President of the Ukrainian World Congress since 2008, having previously served two terms as the President of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress. He is a senior partner at Lavery, de Billy, L.L.P. in Montreal with a practice including corporate and commercial litigation, shareholder oppression remedies and banking litigation. He has been a member of the Board of Directors of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress since 1994 and the Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky Institute Foundation since 2005. He has received several awards, including the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal, the Order of Merit of Ukraine, and the Shevchenko Medal from the Ukrainian Canadian Congress.

Orest Deychakiwsky

Orest Deychakiwsky, until his very recent retirement, was a senior staff advisor at the U.S. Commission on Security and Cooperation in Europe whose country responsibilities included Ukraine, Belarus and Bulgaria; during his illustrious three decade long career, he served as a member of U.S. delegations to numerous OSCE/CSCCE meetings and as an international election observer in Ukraine, Belarus, Russia, Bulgaria, Slovakia and Bosnia. Mr. Deychakiwsky has authored or co-authored a sizable number of speeches, statements, resolutions, and articles on issues pertaining to Ukraine or U.S.-Ukrainian relations.

Andrij Dobriansky

Andrij Dobriansky serves a multitude of functions within the worldwide Ukrainian diaspora community, principally as a community organizer, as well as a decorated artist and frequently as the face of the Ukrainian American community in the media. He has appeared on such outlets as The Daily Show, Al Jazeera, MSNBC, PBS, TRT, Voice of America and others speaking on a variety of on issues surrounding Ukraine, Russia, Eastern European culture and identity, as well as leadership and activism in a global world. Andrij serves as UCCA's Director of Communications and Media and continues to represent his local New York City community at the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America (UCCA), as well as the global Ukrainian Diaspora as a representative of the Ukrainian World Congress (UWC) to the United Nations.

Andrew J Futey

Andrew J Futey, in September 2016, was elected to a four-year term as President of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America, the representative organization of over 1.5 million Americans of Ukrainian descent; he concurrently serves as a Vice President of the Ukrainian World Congress. Mr. Futey brings more than 20 years of extensive government and campaign experience as President of Andrew J Futey & Associates. His firm provides public policy and government relations consulting, strategic planning, public affairs and campaign development strategies at the international, federal, state and local levels. His clients have included Ohio and out-of-state Fortune 500 Companies, Major Corporations, Small Businesses, Community Non-Profit Organizations, Professional and State Associations and Governmental Entities.

Bohdan Futey

Bohdan Futey has served as Judge of the United States Court of Federal Claims since 1987. Judge Futey is actively involved with Democratization and Rule of Law programs organized by the Judicial Conference of the United States, the Department of State, and the American Bar Association in Ukraine and Russia. He has participated in judicial exchange programs, seminars, and workshops and has been a consultant to the working group on Ukraine's Constitution and Ukrainian Parliament.

Roma Hadzewycz

Roma Hadzewycz is editor-in-chief of The Ukrainian Weekly (since 1980) and of Svoboda (since 2007). She holds a B.A. in journalism and psychology from New York University and an M.A. in journalism with a concentration in politics, also from NYU. She is editor of four books released by The Ukrainian Weekly: “*The Great Famine in Ukraine: The Unknown Holocaust*” (1983, second edition -1988; co-edited with George Zarycky and Marta Kolomayets), “*The Ukrainian Weekly 2000*” – *Volume I, 1933-1969* (2000; co-edited with Irene Jarosewich) and *Volume II, 1970-1999* (2001) and “*Ukraine Lives!*” (2002). She served as an advisor of the Ukrainian National Association for two and a half terms, 1990-1998 and 2001-2002.

Lubomyr Hajda

Lubomyr Hajda is Associate Director of the Ukrainian Research Institute at Harvard University. A historian with a Ph.D. from Harvard University, he has taught at Harvard and the University of Massachusetts-Amherst. From 1978 to 1992 he held the position of Academic Coordinator of Harvard’s Master’s program in Soviet studies. Among Dr. Hajda’s publications are the entry on Ukrainian history in the Encyclopaedia Britannica (15th ed.), *The Nationalities Factor in Soviet Politics Society* (with M. Beissinger), and *Ukraine in the World: Studies in the International Relations and Security Structure of a Newly Independent State*.

Victor Hetmanczuk

Victor Hetmanczuk is the President and CEO of the Canada-Ukraine Foundation and a member of the National Board of Directors of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress. He is also the current Director of the Ukrainian World Congress Humanitarian Initiatives Committee. After spending 30 years in the oil sector working as a chemical engineer, Mr. Hetmanczuk took up various executive positions in the Canadian Charity sector for 16 years. Concurrently, he was actively involved with the Ukrainian Canadian community through a number of leadership roles, including as Treasurer of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada, and Treasurer of the Ukrainian World Foundation.

Renata Holod

Renata Holod is College of Women Class of 1963 Professor in the Humanities, History of Art Department and Curator in the Near East Section, Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology, both at the University of Pennsylvania. She has carried out archeological and architectural fieldwork in Syria, Iran, Morocco, Turkey, Central Asia, Tunisia, and Ukraine. Dr. Holod recently completed a term (2013-2017) as President of The Ukrainian Museum of New York. She is co-author and co-editor of *City in the Desert* (1978); *Architecture and Community: Building in the Islamic World Today*, Aperture, New York, (1983); *The Mosque and the Modern World* (1997); *The City in the Islamic World* (2008) and *Island Through Time: Jerba Studies* (2009).

Vasyl Hrytsak

Vasyl Hrytsak is the current head of the Security Service of Ukraine (SBU), having received his appointment from Verkhovna Rada in 2015. For fruitful track record in Anti-Terrorist Operations (ATO), he was awarded by President Poroshenko in 2016 with the coveted rank of General of the Army. General Hrytsak's appointments to senior posts in the SBU began in the aftermath of the Orange Revolution; from 2005 until 2009, he served as the head of the SBU's regional departments in Kiev and Kiev Oblast and in the 2009-2010 period, he headed the SBU department "K", a unit especially devoted to fighting corruption and organized crime.

Paul Grod

Paul Grod presently serves as National President of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress, an organization that represents over 1.2 million Canadians of Ukrainian descent; he has held that post since October 2007. Concurrently, he is President and CEO of Rodan Energy, a leading North American smart grid company. Prior to his election as UCC President, Mr. Grod served as the Congress’ Vice President and member of the Board of Directors (since 2001); during that period, he also chaired or served on a number of UCC National Committees including Justice, Internment and Canada Ukraine. For his efforts at the UCC as well as the various posts he has held in the UWC, Mr. Grod was named in 2014 by the Embassy Magazine & Hill Times’ Power and Influence magazine as one of the top 100 people influencing Canada’s global future.

Valerii Kuchynskyi

Valerii Kuchynskyi occupied important posts both at home and abroad during the course of his professional career in the Ukrainian Foreign Service, which spanned a period of three and a half decades. His last assignment was to serve as Permanent Representative of Ukraine to the United Nations 2000-2006. Since January 2007, Ambassador Kuchynskyi has been engaged as Adjunct Professor of International and Public Affairs at SIPA, Columbia University. He has been teaching various courses dealing with the United Nations, Ukraine's Foreign Policy and current political situation in the country. He has been active in organizing and participating in numerous panels, round tables, conferences and other fora on international relations and foreign policy.

Larissa Kyj

Larissa Kyj is a full professor in the Accounting and Finance Department at Rowan University; her research interested include bank efficiency, budgeting and accounting history. Concurrently, Dr. Kyj is the President of the United Ukrainian Relief Committee (UUARC), a Ukrainian American charitable organization founded in 1944. She is also on the executive boards of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America (UCCA) and the Women's Association for the Defense of Four Freedoms for Ukraine (WADFFU).

Linas Linkevičius

Linas Linkevičius, the Republic of Lithuania's current Minister of Foreign Affairs since 2012, has held a remarkable list of senior government posts during his distinguished career; he served as Minister of National Defence from 1993 to 1996 and from 2000 to 2004, Head of the Lithuanian Mission to the WEU and NATO from 1997 to 2000, as the Lithuanian Permanent Representative to the North Atlantic Council from 2005 until 2011. Throughout his tenures, Ambassador Linkevičius has corroborated Lithuania's status as an advanced Euro-Atlantic democracy within many international and multilateral entities and organizations, including The UN, NATO, The EU. Of particular note, Lithuania's senior diplomat has been a constant opponent within the European Union and NATO of compromises with Russia over Ukraine.

Askold Lozynskyj

Askold Lozynskyj, admitted to the New York State Bar in 1977, specializes in commercial and real estate transactions and litigation and non-for-profit law. He has devoted many hours of work representing Ukrainian non-for-profit organizations, organizing and filing for tax exempt status, served as Counsel in numerous de-naturalization, deportation and social security suspension proceedings involving Ukrainian-Americans accused of material misrepresentation of wartime activities, and represented the Ukrainian American community in a legal proceeding against CBS News before the Federal Communications Commission. He has concurrently held a notable number of senior Hromada posts including the UCCA presidency (1992-2000), the UWC presidency (1998-2008) and the presidency of ICSU (2009-2013).

Iryna Mycak

Iryna Mycak chairs the UWC 50th Anniversary Organizing Committee which has spearheaded a commemorative program that began on 26 February 2017 and will culminate on 11 November 2017. The program included five days of events in Ukraine, among them a commemoration in the capital city of Kyiv with the participation of President of Ukraine Petro Poroshenko. Iryna Mycak also chairs the UWC International Media & Public Relations Committee. She is also active in raising awareness of the Holodomor, serving as Chair of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress National Holodomor Awareness Committee.

Tamara Olexy

Tamara Olexy has just completed her second term as President of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America (UCCA) and has returned to work as the Executive Director of the UCCA National Office in New York. She is also a member of the Ukrainian World Congress' Board of Directors and serves as the chair of their International Council on United Nations Affairs. In the early nineties, Ms. Olexy was director of the Ukrainian National Information Service (UNIS) bureau in Washington, DC and therefore had a uniquely

convenient vantage point from which to observe key events in the modern Ukrainian state's formative history.

Roman Popadiuk

Roman Popadiuk, a former U.S. Ambassador to Ukraine, is an International Affairs Advisor and former Principal for Morgan Lewis Consulting; concurrently, he serves as the World Affairs Councils of America's Chairman of the national Board of Directors. A retired member of the career Senior Foreign Service, Dr. Popadiuk brings more than 30 years of experience in the areas of national security, political risk analysis, communications strategy and energy policy, including serving on the National Security Councils of Presidents Ronald Reagan and George Bush. With his vast experience and contacts that span the globe, he brings a unique insight into international political and business matters.

Borys Potapenko

Borys Potapenko is a Member of the External Affairs Committee of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America and Chairman, ad interim, of the International Council in Support of Ukraine. In the late 1970s and early 1980s, he was the representative to the United Nations from the World Congress of Free Ukrainians and, its successor, the Ukrainian World Congress. Concurrently, he serves as Senior Professional Staffer to the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Indonesia to the United Nations and the Association of South East Asian Nations. More recent postings have included service on the External Affairs Committee of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress and the Canada-Ukraine Advisory Committee at the Canadian Foreign Ministry.

Stefan Romaniw

Stefan Romaniw OAM serves as General Secretary of the Ukrainian World Congress, the entity formally tasked with representing the global Ukrainian Hromada. Mr. Romaniw concurrently holds the position of Executive Director of Community Languages Australia. He served successive terms as Chairperson of the Victoria Provincial Multicultural Commission. In his role as UWC General Secretary, he has performed double duty as Chair of the International Standing Committee on the 1932-33 Holodomor; his myriad and tireless efforts to highlight the great Ukrainian tragedy globally have received wide praise.

Michael Sawkiw

Michael Sawkiw is the former President of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America (UCCA), the leading representative organization of the Ukrainian American community. He was first elected President in October 2000 in Chicago and subsequently re-elected in September 2004 in Philadelphia. Since 1996, he has served as Director of the UCCA's Washington, DC bureau – the Ukrainian National Information Service. His key achievements in Washington have included the formation of the Congressional Ukrainian Caucus in 1997; advocating the graduation of Ukraine from the Jackson-Vanik amendment; and, most notably, passage by the United States Congress of a bill to authorize the construction of a monument to the victims of the Ukrainian Famine-Genocide of 1932-1933 in Washington, DC.

Yuri Sergejev

Yuri Sergejev is currently Senior Fellow at Yale University's MacMillan Center. Prior to his present appointment, he served nearly three decades as a Ukrainian diplomat. Among his most prominent postings, Dr. Sergejev served as Ukraine's envoy to Greece and head of the Directorate General for Foreign Policy of the Administration of the President of Ukraine (1997-2003), envoy to France and, concurrently, the country's permanent representative to UNESCO (2003-2007) and Permanent Representative of Ukraine to the United Nations (2007-2015). As Ukraine's voice in the UN, he led the country's diplomatic efforts to highlight Russia's illegal annexation of Crimea and Russia's continuing "Hybrid War" against Ukraine in UA's industrial heartland---the Donbas region.

Marko Suprun

Marko Suprun is currently acting director of Patriot Defence, the humanitarian initiative of the UWC, that provides medical training to civilian and military professionals. Occasionally, he co-hosts the English

language digest of StopFake, an organization that dismantles Russian disinformation about Ukraine as well as sometimes co-hosting the Ukraine Calling English language radio program on Hromadske Radio in Kyiv. He is also a founding member of #BABYLON'13. He has a masters of arts from Columbia University in the City of New York and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa.

Orysia Sushko

Orysia Sushko, as a Member of the Order of Canada, has served as Citizenship Judge overseeing the induction of new Canadian citizens. As a former national president of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress during the critical period of the Orange Revolution in Ukraine, her efforts included fundraising for the Elections Observer Mission and liaising with Ukrainian government and Canadian government officials. Presently, Ms. Sushko is the president of the World Federation of Ukrainian Women's Organizations, which coordinates the efforts of 31 national women's organizations in 21 countries. At the core of WFUWO's mission is support for the dignity and integrity of women in Ukraine and worldwide, as well as efforts that support Ukraine's development into an independent and stable democracy.

Volodymyr Yelchenko

Volodymyr Yelchenko has served as Permanent Representative of Ukraine to the United Nations since December 9, 2015. Immediately prior to his present posting, he was Ambassador of Ukraine to Russia; he held the post from July 2010 until he was recalled for consultations in March 2014, immediately after the illegal annexation of Crimea by the Russian Federation. Ambassador Yelchenko is one of the true veterans of Ukrainian diplomacy, having started in a career in foreign service in 1981.

Kateryna Yushchenko

Kateryna Yushchenko, wife of the Third President of Ukraine Victor Yushchenko (2005-2010), is an Associate Professor (Docent) at the Banking University of Ukraine. She is also Chairman of the Ukraine 3000 Foundation, which promotes citizen involvement in addressing Ukraine's needs in medicine, education, history and the arts. The Foundation has raised and distributed over \$60 million in assistance, and has established such partner organizations as the Ukrainian Cinema Foundation, Center for Museum Development, National Center for Women and Children's Health and Association of Charities of Ukraine. Mrs. Yushchenko moved to Ukraine in June 1991 to run the US-Ukraine Foundation, which she co-founded to support democratic and free market development in the newly sovereign Ukrainian state. Before coming to Ukraine, she held positions at the Joint Economic Committee of Congress, Department of Treasury, The White House, State Department, and the Washington office of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America, UNIS.

Marianna Zajac

Marianna Zajac is President of the Ukrainian National Women's League of America, Inc. (an educational, charitable, cultural not for profit organization uniting women of Ukrainian descent since 1925); First Vice President of The Ukrainian Museum in New York City (founded by The UNWLA in 1976); Board Member of the World Congress of Ukrainians; Honorary Member of the World Federation of Ukrainian Women's Organizations, a member organization of the National Council of Women; participant in the annual United Nations Commission on the Status of Women conferences; presenter at the 2011 (20th) Conference of the World Information Transfer (Health & the Environment); member of the U.S. Holodomor Committee.

Volodymyr Zaryckyj

Volodymyr Zaryckyj is Executive Director of the Center for US-Ukrainian Relations. The Center provides "informational platforms" or venues for senior-level representatives of the political, economic, security, diplomatic and cultural/academic establishments of the United States and Ukraine to exchange views on a wide range of issues of mutual interest, and to showcase what has been referred to as a "burgeoning relationship of notable geopolitical import" between the two nations. Dr. Zaryckyj completed his undergraduate and graduate work at Columbia University; he taught political science at NYU for nearly three decades before moving on in recent years to do postdoctoral research work on Eastern Europe.
